Note (A): The length of boom on which tower crane long boom wage rate shall be based is the distance from the original ground base level of the tower to the point of intersection and from the centerline of the boom to the tip of the boom. In the case of crawler or mobile cranes, where the tower crane attachment is mounted, the long boom provisions of this Agreement shall be computed from the boom pins on the rotation base to the point sheaves.

Note (B): It shall not be considered a condition of employment to maintain CCO/OECP certification, unless documentation is provided that the owner of the project specifies CCO/OECP certification.

NOTE(C): The parties acknowledge that at the time of negotiation of this Master Agreement the Occupational Safety Health Authority (“OSHA”) has announced November 10, 2017, as the compliance date with respect to the Crane Operator Certification requirement. However, given that OSHA has previously extended the implementation date with respect to this matter, the parties believe there remains uncertainty as to whether OSHA will implement on this date. Further, there remains unanswered questions with respect to the full application and impact of the Crane Operator Certification Requirement. Accordingly, the parties agree that the Contractor shall pay the wage rate set forth in Section 9.1, Classification 1(A), 1(B), or 1(C), as applicable, to current bargaining unit members who acquired a CCO/OECP certification on or before May 31, 2016. All bargaining unit members, as of May 31, 2016, who acquire a CCO/OECP certification after May 31, 2016 shall be paid at the wage rate set forth in Section 9.1, Classification 1(A)1, 1(B)1, or 1(C)1, as applicable. CCO/OECP certification shall be verified by the Union upon request by the Employer.
